



INTRODUCTION

The Bible

This is God's book. He used people to do physical writing. Prophets, men of God, the disciples - all wrote down or told other people what it was that God said to them. There are two sections. The Old Testament happened before Jesus was born and the New Testament is about Jesus life, death, resurrection and what his followers did after he went back to heaven.

Genesis

Genesis is the first book in the Bible, and according to tradition, was written by Moses. It's a book about beginnings. It starts by showing how the world and everything in it was created. Then it moves on to Adam and Eve and the beginning of sin as they disobeyed God. The stories of Noah, then Abraham and his descendants - Isaac, Jacob and Joseph follow. Through their lives, *Genesis* reveals God's desire to have a people who would be set apart to worship him. It is important to realise that these words from God are the words that Jesus read. When he preached and taught people from God's word he often used the Old Testament. The Old Testament also told people that Jesus was going to come to this world - long before it actually happened. The book of *Genesis* has examples of prophecies like this.

More Data

The Old and New Testaments are divided up into different sections. The Old Testament is made up of 39 separate books. The New Testament is made up of 27 books. Each book is divided up into smaller sections called chapters. Each chapter is divided up into smaller parts called verses.

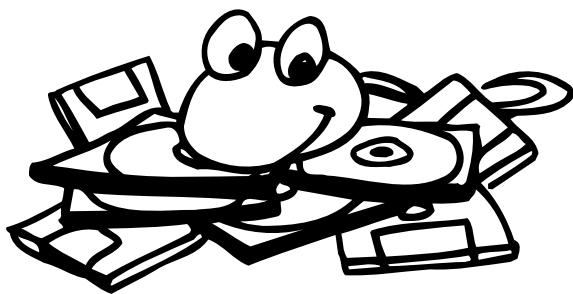
Old Testament:

New Testament:

Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts, Romans, 1 & 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 & 2 Thessalonians, 1 & 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews, James, 1 & 2 Peter, 1,2 & 3 John, Jude, Revelation.

That's great, Click. Thanks for showing us that. So, come on everyone - pick up a pencil, and let's go.

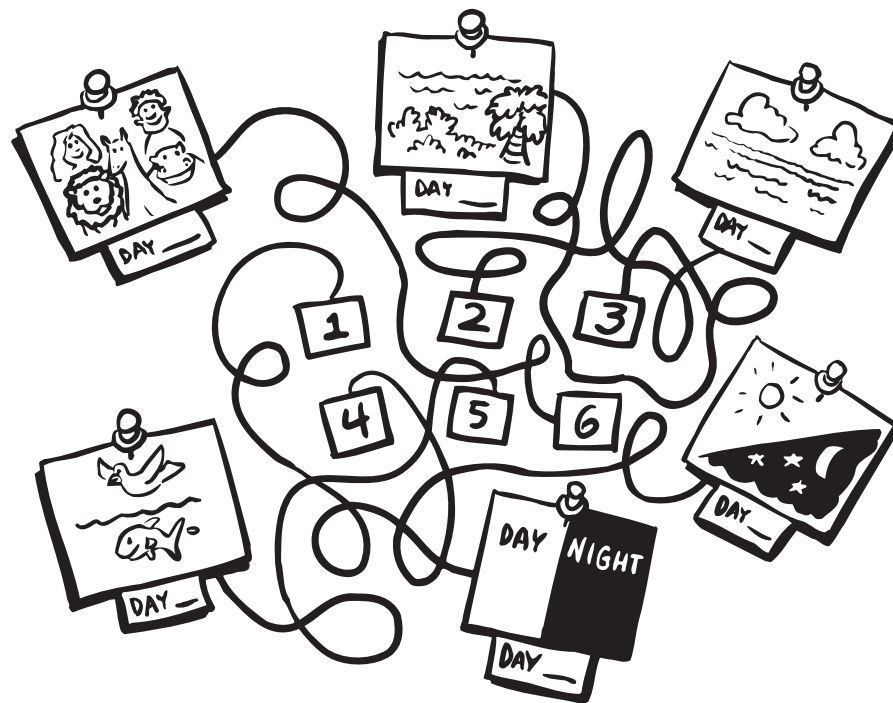


Study One: In the Beginning

Click has printed out some calendars to show what God created each day. Follow the line from the number to the picture to discover the order in which everything was made. Then, write the number on the calendar.



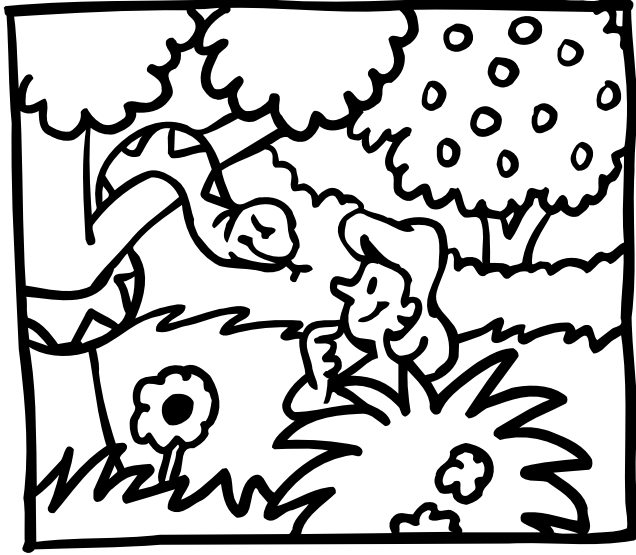
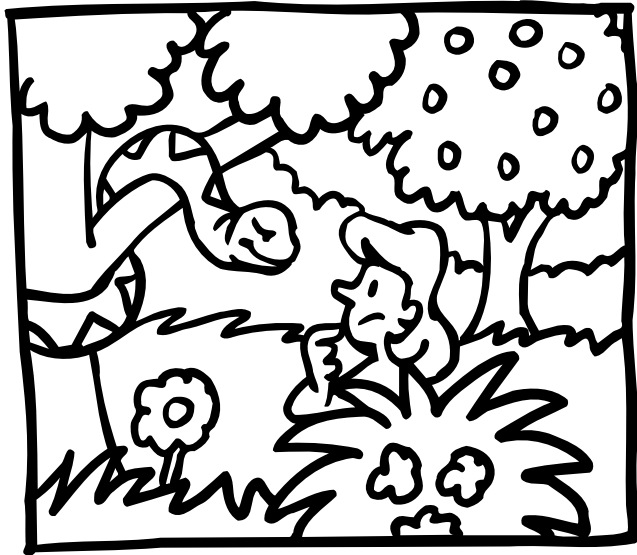
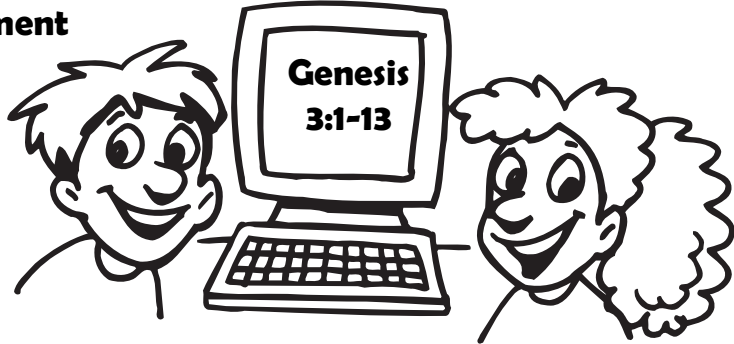

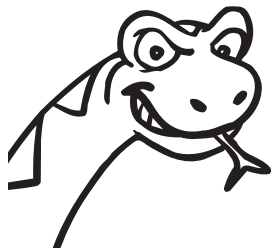
Study Three: The Fall and God's Punishment

Did God really say, you must not eat from any tree in the garden?

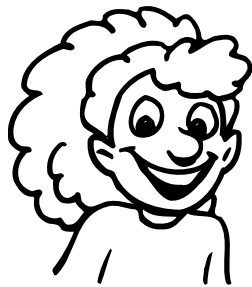
We may eat from trees in the garden, but not from the tree in the middle of it. If we touch it we will die.
